NEW LAW EASES LANDOWNER LIABILITY CONCERNS FOR FARMERS AND HUNTERS

(Camp Hill) - Pennsylvania Farm Bureau says farmers who have allowed hunting on their land will likely continue to do so after the enactment of legislation that increases liability protection for landowners. The legislation (House Bill 13) was signed into law by Governor Ed Rendell on June 30th.

"Farmers now can be more confident that their livelihood won't be at risk when they open their land to hunters. We have wanted our good relationships with hunters to continue because they help us control wildlife damage to our crops while we provide them a place to enjoy recreational activities," said PFB President Carl T. Shaffer. "The General Assembly and Governor Rendell worked effectively on a bipartisan basis to tackle the problem in record time."

House Bill 13 amends the Recreational Use of Land and Water Act (RULWA), which for more than four decades has provided liability protection for actions that occur on a landowner's property as a result of recreational activity -- such as hunting, fishing, swimming and hiking -- as long as the landowner does not charge a fee. The need to amend RULWA was sparked by a 2006 court case in which a farmer from Lehigh County was found partially liable for injuries caused by a hunter's stray bullet, which struck a woman a half-mile away.

House Bill 13 had widespread support, as the House and Senate unanimously passed the measure.

The new law balances the rights of landowners with the rights of potential victims. While the law provides reasonable liability safeguards for farmers and other landowners, the law does not prevent an injured party from recovering damages from the individual who caused the injury.

The new law takes effect immediately. We thank the Farm Bureau for all their lobbying efforts on behalf of this legislation.

TB TEST PATENT FOR MEDFORD FIRM

Will give quicker results and help in food-related cases

A Medford-based biochemical company has received a patent for new methodology that will allow animal handlers to test for tuberculosis in a matter of minutes.

The test, developed by Medford-based Chembio Diagnostic Inc., will enable zoo veterinarians and slaughterhouse operators to test livestock for TB and receive results in 20 minutes or less -- a vast improvement over the three days required by some methods.

Because the disease can be transmitted between animals and humans, it is seen as crucial that livestock intended

for human consumption be monitored for infection.

But typical methods for monitoring TB infection in slaughterhouses have a reported sensitivity of less than 50 percent.

And skin-injection tests used on live animals often require repeated screening and can take up to three days to deliver results, a Chembio release said.

The new tests will be marketed under the company's Stat-Pak trademark, which already includes products to test for HIV antibodies, sickle cell anemia and human TB, vice president of marketing Les Stutzman said in the

company statement.

He said there will be purpose-marketed tests for elephants, camels and cows, among other species.

Chembio estimates the total commercial global market for such a product at \$50 million per year. The company is seeking domestic and international distributors for the new line of products.

The company showed strong sales growth and a softening of earnings losses in its most recent quarterly results, announced last month, based largely on sales of its rapid HIV test.

NORTH AMERICAN DEER FARMER'S ASSOCIATION HIRES NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Shawn Schafer of Turtle Lake, North Dakota has been hired as the new Executive Director of the North American Deer Farmer's Association.

Shawn, along with his wife Lani, daughters Savannah and Cassidy, and his brother Clark began raising whitetail deer in 1998. He has been a member of NADeFA since 1998 and has also served as chairman of the NADeFA Whitetail Council and the Animal Health Committee. Shawn was appointed as the whitetail representative for the cervid tuberculosis working group in 2003 and is currently a member of the United States Animal Health Association. He has previously served as the cervid representative for the North Dakota Department of Agriculture Non-Traditional Livestock Advisory Council. He was later appointed as the Non-Traditional Livestock Representative for the North Dakota State Board of Animal Health. Shawn is a founding member and current president of the North Dakota Deer Ranchers and is also a member of many state cervid associations as well as a member of the Exotic Wildlife Association and Safari Club International.

Shawn was recognized in 2006 by Whitetails of Wisconsin for his dedication and service to the cervid industry. In 2007 he was chosen as a NADeFA Honorary Member and also received the Exotic Wildlife Association Executive Director's Award.

NADeFA President Carolyn Laughlin stated, "We welcome Shawn as our newest executive director and know he will use his talents and knowledge to make this association one of the top national organizations."

MOBILE LABORATORY DESIGNED TO HELP PROTECT PENNSYLVANIA AGAINST ANIMAL DISEASE

To respond more quickly to potentially dangerous animal health emergencies, the Department of Agriculture has begun using a new mobile laboratory.

As part of the Pennsylvania Animal Diagnostic Laboratory System, the mobile laboratory has a bio-safety Level-3 (BSL-3) containment space, meaning its air handling system prevents the escape of any pathogens that could endanger humans or animals. In addition, it is equipped with a showering facility, bio-safety cabinets, refrigerators and freezers, and decontamination equipment. The laboratory is being fitted with other testing instruments to offer a rapid diagnosis for other animal diseases like avian influenza, foot and mouth disease or mad cow disease, among others.

The mobile unit was purchased with an emergency health preparedness grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Health and the Centers for Disease Control. The Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Animal Health & Diagnostic Services works closely with both groups to stay on the leading edge of animal disease research and prevention.

The bureau is responsible for the control and eradication of dis-

eases in livestock and poultry, which affect human health or cause significant economic loss to farmers. It also administers regulatory programs for animal health certification, containment of diseased animals and elimination of disease agents. Together with regulatory inspections and testing programs, the bureau uses public outreach and educational programs to ensure that Pennsylvania residents consume foods that meet the highest standards.

"Pennsylvania is in the forefront of addressing animal health issues," Agriculture Secretary Dennis Wolff said. "By working diligently to avoid potential outbreaks, we also are protecting our human food supply so people can to continue to enjoy safe, high-quality foods.

"An outbreak would be disastrous to Pennsylvania's economy and our agricultural producers due to trade and marketing opportunities that would be closed. This mobile unit will help the department act quickly and efficiently should a dangerous situation occur." Secretary Wolff pointed out.

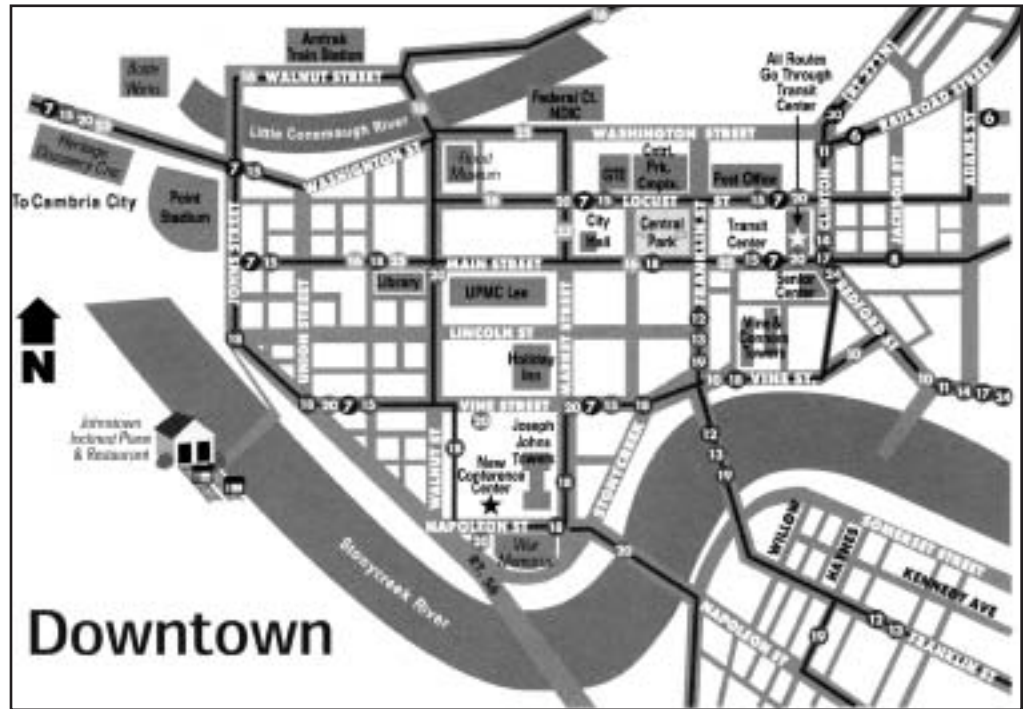
